The ABCs of Christmas

The Christmas season is a special time of year. It is full of anticipation and excitement, busyness and wondering (what I'm getting for Christmas), baking and visiting. So much to do and see. Unfortunately, it is so easy to get caught up in the frenzy of the season that the true meaning of Christmas gets shoved aside.

I encourage you to simplify, to declutter and even get rid of those things that hinder you from truly enjoying God's gift of Christmas this year. What is at the essence of the Christmas story? Let me suggest you consider the ABC's of Christmas:

A - Adore. Adore simply means to worship, to admire and to be extremely fond of. In Luke 2:20 *The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.* In Matthew 2:11, the Magi (wise men) *"saw the child with his mother Mary, and bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts ..."* For the shepherds and the wise men, the appropriate response to seeing Jesus was to worship him! This Jesus was more than just a baby. The prophet Isaiah called him *Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.* (Isa 9:6). The shepherds were told they would see the Saviour, the long awaited Messiah. The wise men followed the star to worship the King. Jesus throughout the Old and New Testaments is called the King of kings and Lord of lords.

B - Believe. We need to believe who he said he was - John 14:6 says Jesus is *"the way, the truth and the life."* If we want to know God, we need to believe who Jesus is. We also need to believe that Jesus had a purpose in coming. Luke 19:10 says that Jesus came *"to seek and to save what was lost."*

C - Celebrate. The whole reason for the season is found in the birth of Jesus Christ. Luke 2:17-18 says of the shepherds, *"when they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them."* The shepherds increased their joy by spreading the good news of Jesus' birth.

The ABC's of Christmas is for all who wish to participate in the true meaning of the Christmas story. It is not a spectator sport. To be actively engaged means that you have to adore Him - to worship him with all of who we are, our whole being. We need to believe who he is and what he came to do. Finally, keeping Christmas to ourselves will rob us of the greatest opportunity we have to discover true joy and truly have a merry Christmas. Therefore we need to celebrate, to have a party, bring your friends and share with others the greatest gift ever given - Jesus Christ.
