Mission Team to Romania


Another new year comes with another Trip for the Missions team! This year, we were blessed with the opportunity to go to Rasa, Romania! Partnering with Gateway to Hope Romania, we had the opportunity to serve the community in Rasa in several ways. We landed in Bucharest on Saturday afternoon and were greeted by our lovely host, Reinhart Neufeld, as well as our translators for the week. During our week in Rasa and other neighboring villages, we spent our days giving back to the community - whether it be House calls or performing our programs in schools. Most days were fast-paced and packed with things to do but there were a few days where we had time to connect and bond with the people there - which I can say was our whole team's favorite part.

Our main translator was Andrada; a high school student like us. During our stay, she easily felt like part of our team. Her family, including her older sister Naomi, and her sister's husband Eremia, all played a big role in helping us communicate with the people there. Their passion for God was evident through our time with them and it was inspiring to see people, only two or three years older than us, so passionate about serving the Lord. Without them, we wouldn't have been able to help and connect on the level that we did. We are all grateful to them.

We stayed at the Gateway to Hope Centre in Rasa where we not only ate, bathed, and slept, but also hosted programs for people ranging from young kids to old ladies. Some churches invited us to perform and talk during their youth groups where, admittedly, we felt like celebrities with everyone asking us for photos! We would perform our program for them which would consist of a skit, a song either in English or Romanian, a game, and a testimony. It is safe to say that our skits were the most popular of all. This was partly because of Ezra Kleinsasser executing a perfect backflip during one of the skits, but also because of the message behind them. The most impactful part of the trip for most of us were the house visits we did in the neighbouring villages. We were exposed to poverty and despair, and it was an eye opening experience to be able to witness it.

Despite most people's circumstances, they were all joyful. Their faith in Christ led them through their hardships, and it was truly humbling and inspiring to see. The Romanian people are kind and hospitable and give freely despite their own difficult circumstances. We were truly blessed to be able to work amongst these people and to be part of God's work in Romania. Seeing the Spirit at work in so many ways was such a privilege to witness.
